1. The History of Badminton:

Badminton House and Estate lies in the heart of the Gloucestershire countryside and is the private home of the 11th Duke and Duchess of Beaufort and the Somerset family. The House is not normally open to the general public, it dates from the 17th century and is set in a beautiful deer park which hosts the world famous Badminton Horse Trials.

The Great Hall at Badminton House is famous for an incident on a rainy day in 1863 when the game of badminton was said to have been invented by friends of the 8th Duke of Beaufort. We know the game of Battledore was being played at Badminton House as well as other country houses as far back as the early 1800's. Battledore or Shuttlecock as it was sometimes called was a game where two players would hit the shuttlecock backwards and forwards to each other, counting how many times they could do this without it falling on the floor. The Battledore bats had fine leather covered shafts, almost circular heads and instead of having strings the heads are covered in vellum.

Shuttlecocks at this time would almost certainly have been made of chicken feathers pushed into cork and would have been twice the size and weight as we know them today.

On that rainy day in 1863 one of the guests had the idea of putting some string across from the door to the fireplace in the Great Hall and hitting the shuttle over the string to each other.

The Great Hall at Badminton House is the same size as the badminton court as we know it today, 44 feet (13.4m) by 20 feet (6.09m)

The Badminton Association was formed at a meeting at Dunbar, Waverley Grove in Southsea, Hampshire on 13th September 1893. At the meeting there were nine clubs represented, they decided on the rules of the Association and framed the rules for the game of badminton. It was the first National Association in the world. The popularity of the sport increased rapidly with 300 clubs being introduced by the 1920's, rising to 9,000 shortly after World War 2. The Badminton Association would govern world badminton until 1934. In 1934 the Badminton Association changed its name to the Badminton Association of England and again in 2005 to Badminton England.

The first recorded open tournament (open to anyone) was staged by Guilford Badminton Club in 1898. It was so successful that the Badminton Association followed suit and the following year a one-day tournament was held at the London Scottish Rifles Drill Hall in London on the 4th April 1899. This was the birth of the All England Championships the world's oldest and most prestigious badminton tournament. The All England Championships has been sponsored by Yonex since 1984.

In 1903 the first international badminton match was played in Dublin between Ireland and England. England won 5-2.

The International Badminton Federation (IBF) was formed in 1934 with nine founding members: England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, Denmark, Holland, Canada, New Zealand and France, as a consequence the Badminton Association became the Badminton Association of England. From nine founding members, the IBF, now called the Badminton World Federation (BWF), has over 176 member nations.

The World's first open badminton tournament was played in the Royal Albert Hall, London September 1979. The tournament was open to both professionals as well as amateurs. 20 of the top players in the world were invited and it was sponsored by Friends Provident. The tournament marked the arrival of Open Badminton and gave players an opportunity to receive money for winning while playing badminton. There had been much debate and heated argument for many years variously described as amateurism, professionalism and sham amateurism. It was at the International Badminton Federation's AGM in May 1979 that revised rules were adopted, which would not harm aspirations for badminton to become an Olympic sport.

Badminton was officially granted Olympic status in the 1992 Barcelona Games. Indonesia was the dominant force in that first Olympic tournament, winning two golds, a silver and a bronze; the country's first Olympic medals in its history. More than 1.1 billion people watched the 1992 Olympic Badminton competition on television.

Eight years later, and more than a century after introducing Badminton to the world, Britain claimed their first medal in the Olympics when Simon Archer and Jo Goode achieved Mixed Doubles Bronze in Sydney. At the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens Nathan Robertson and Gail Emms won a silver medal in the Mixed Doubles. In 2016 at the Rio Games Marcus Ellis & Chris Langridge won a Bronze Medal in the Men's Doubles.

Only four countries have won the Thomas Cup (world men's team championships) since its inception in 1948: Malaysia, Indonesia, China and Denmark. Only four countries have won the Uber Cup (world women's team championships) since its inception in 1956: USA, Japan, China and Indonesia.

2. Olympic Games:

Badminton was included as a Demonstration Sport for the first time at the Olympic Games in Munich in September 1972. An Invitation Tournament was held and Elliot Stuart, Derek Talbot and Gillian Gilks were invited to compete. Derek Talbot and Gillian Gilks won the mixed doubles.

Darren Hall represented England in a demonstration of Badminton at the 1988 Olympics in Seoul, South Korea on 19th September 1988.

4. Sudirman Cup:

The Sudirman Cup is the World Mixed Team Championship, which takes place every two years. There are five matches in every round: Men's and Women's Singles, Men's and Women's Doubles and Mixed Doubles. The Cup was given by the Badminton Association of Indonesia as a memorial to the late Dick Sudirman, a long-serving member of the BWF council, first as a Councillor and then as a Vice-President, was known as the father of Indonesian badminton and was a champion player in his own right. He was the founder of the PBSI and served as its President for 22 years.

6. Uber Cup:

The Uber Cup, the World Women's Team Championship, has been held every two years since 1984, amended from three years previously, after merging with the Thomas Cup, played in the same period and venue.

The Uber Cup was presented by the former English international and All England Champion, Betty Uber, who had the idea of creating a women's event similar to Thomas Cup for men in New Zealand back in 1950. She also made the draw for the inaugural 1956-1957 tournament, which took place at Lytham St. Annes in Lancashire.

In 1996 Divisions 1 and 2 became the National Championships Premier A and Premier B open only to first teams. The ten teams in each Division came together at central venues on three weekends and each team played each other team once, the competition being decided by the total number of matches won. The remaining Divisions were redesignated Regional Championships Divisions 1 to 5 and their structure remained unaltered but a new points system was introduced.

In 2000-2001 Premier B was opened to second teams.

In 2004-2005 Promotion between Premier Division B and Division 1 of the regional championships was changed to four up (eligible teams topping sections A-D) and four down.

Since 2006-2007 the Championships have been played using the new Laws of Badminton, rally points scoring.

In 2007-2008 Promotion between Premier Division B and Division 1 of the Regional Championships returned to two up (eligible teams topping sections A-D) and two down using playoffs.
